Security System and Fire Monitoring RFP
Amended Q & A Document

Q: What is the Davis Bacon classification and classification code for the work being performed in this contract?

A: The classification for electrician will be utilized. The corresponding code is ELEC0082-004.

Q: Does your current fire system come back to your security panel for monitoring?

A: Yes.

Q: Do you want to keep your POTS lines for the fire and security monitoring, or would you like to switch to cellular?

A: The Department prefers to keep the dedicated POTS lines.

Q: You currently have a combined security and fire monitoring system. Do you want to continue this, or would you prefer to split these?

A: The Department would like to separate these.

Q: When does your current security and fire monitoring contract end?

A: October 2021.

Q: Do you want the security monitoring tied into your network?

A: No, we want to keep these separate from our network.

Q: How many employees will need access to a mobile app for security system control?

A: No more than 4 employees will need access to this app. All other designated employees will continue to use a code to access the building.

The three questions below were added to the Q&A Document on August 31, 2021:

Q: Could you clarify the intent of Multiple Group Control and what it means in some more detail?

A: These are the burglary, mechanical, motion detectors and door contacts. Department would like the system to allow these groups to be turned on or off if there is a malfunction (bypass ability). Department requires this feature in the new system.

Q: Could you clarify the intent of Daily Operation Schedules and what this means in some more detail?

A: The building's normal hours are set for 8:00am-4:30pm, but from 6:00pm to 5:00am Department can restrict non-essential employees from coming in, and if they do the alarm company will notify Department. The system can also restrict building access on holidays. Department requires this feature in the new system.

Q: Could you clarify the intent of Schedule Limits and what this means in some more detail?

A: This goes along with the Daily Operation Schedules question above. This deals with setting temporary and permanent schedules. If a temporary schedule is set, it will delete that setting once it reaches the programmed time and date. Department requires this feature in the new system.
