The Clark County Manufacturing Collaborative (CCMC) is for individuals interested in getting or advancing their skills in one of four high-demand areas of manufacturing. Right now, there are hundreds of jobs going unfilled in Clark County for:

- Advanced Machining

For selected participants, this program will cover the costs of manufacturing skill upgrade training and nationally recognized manufacturing credentials that employers require of new hires.

## Eligible training participants include low-income adults and dislocated workers.

### General Eligibility Requirements – Adult and Dislocated Worker:

- 18 Years of age or older
- Authorized to work in the United States
- Meet low-income guidelines of the Workforce Investment Act
